Position Summary

Nourish Nova Scotia is looking for an experienced Communications Assistant with a passion for food culture and heritage that will act as a Food Culture and Communications Ambassador for our organization. As a community-based non-profit, we are committed to applying an EDI (Equity, Diversity, Inclusion) lens to our work and actioning the learning, unlearning and relearning associated with this approach. This position will focus on reflecting our diverse communities in the resources we create so everyone feels welcome at the table, with a focus on BIPOC, Mi'kmaw, African Nova Scotian, new Canadian and Acadian/Francophone youth.

Specific Duties

Community Outreach/Engagement:

✓ Use leadership skills to facilitate discussions with diverse communities to gain insight into the history and ever-changing story (past and present) of food in Nova Scotia and to identify needs/gaps.

- ✓ Building relationships with existing and new stakeholders.
- ✓ Collaborate with stakeholders, including other non-profits, to identify a common agenda and advance the project.
- ✓ Facilitate first-voice youth engagement through avenues such as social media and focus groups.

Digital Media:

- Based on insights gained through discussions with stakeholders, develop resources (video/book/calendar/digital downloads) representative of the culture and food heritage of the communities we serve.
- Design, create and/or write accessible content for digital marketing platforms (including social media, blogs, website and newsletters) while utilizing digital media best practices.
- ✓ Help inform an inclusive and accessible digital media strategy, as needed.

Skills and Qualifications

- Currently studying or graduated from a program with a focus on any of the following: communications, digital media/marketing, community development or related discipline
- ✓ Able to work independently and as part of a team
- ✓ Strong communications skills—both oral and written
- ✓ Able to write compelling copy
- ✓ Familiarity and comfort using digital communication tools (i.e. emails, social media, virtual meeting platforms etc.)

- Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident
- Have a valid Social Insurance Number at the start of employment and be legally entitled to work in Canada

Nourish is located in Kwipek, or so-called Bedford, part of Mi'kmak'i, the unceded and ancestral territory of the Mi'kmaq peoples. While this is where our offices are located, we support food work from Unama'ki to Kespukwitk. As Treaty people, we strive to work under the Peace and Friendship Treaty of 1752 by incorporating Mi'kmaw values, like cooperation, stewardship of nature and sharing, into what we do, but recognize that we have much learning and unlearning still to do. Nourish recognizes the inequities connected to colonization and commit to working towards creating an equitable, diverse, and inclusive and community for all.
