


School food gardens and growing spaces teach essential skills for students' success and well-being.

## Choosing a Location for a School Garden

#### Mel's Mix Method

High yield soil mixture method when you want good productivity out of a small growing space.

# The Caja Indoor Growing Box Method

Large self-watering container method that may be ideal for your learning space.

#### **Seed Time**

A free garden planner app that is really useful if you are interested in succession planting- growing multiple crops in the same space between early spring and late fall or working with a greenhouse. It creates a useful growing calendar based on the growing conditions specific to your area.

#### Nova Scotia School Garden Resource Guide

This document was created through a partnership with Dr. Arthur Hines School in Summerville (West Hants), the Dalhousie Faculty of Agriculture and Active Living- West Hants Municipality. # **Funding**

Discover diverse grants tailored to fund various growing projects, with many recurring annually, making them ideal targets to sustain operations or investment in the upcoming growing year.

# **Grow Eat Learn 2025 Garden Grants**

Up to \$500 to support a NS school growing project- from vegetable garden to food forest. Available immediately. Grants will be allocated in the order of application completion (approx. 30 minutes to complete). Coming early May 2025.

# Whole Kids Foundation- Garden Grant Program

Up to \$3000. Schools and non-profit organizations can turn outdoor spaces into powerful hands-on learning gardens that connect kids with food, spark their curiosity and support classroom curriculum. Applications open in February and close in March.

## **TD Friends of the Environment Foundation Grant**

From \$1000 to \$10 000. Community Gardens are eligible if they focus on at least one environmental issue. Application period is ongoing, application deadline dates are Jan. 15th and July 15th.

# Medavie Healthy Living Funding

The aim of this funding is to strengthen community food systems. Must be an organization. Can support expansion or re-designs of community gardens. Applications ongoing

# Farm to Cafeteria Canada Funding List

Click on 'Funding' heading at top of page. Includes a list of 10 grants (some already mentioned here) as well as resources on fundraising for your growing project. This resource list more generally is very thorough and compliments this resource guide.

#### Nova Scotia Health Wellness Funds

Open until April 30th supporting community-based projects. Includes separate streams for Health Promoting Schools and Community Gardens.

# **Howl Micro-grant Program**

Grant provides youth with small, one-time microgrants of up to \$5000 to carry out innovative youth-led community projects. Ongoing, next application due July 31, 2025.

# **Greening Canada's School Grounds: Community Tree Grants**

This Tree Canada program funds many elements of planting and maintaining trees on school grounds. Grants up to \$10 000. Applications open from October to early December.
